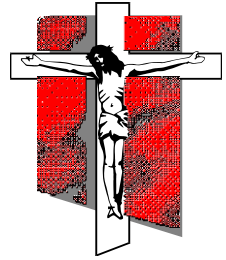

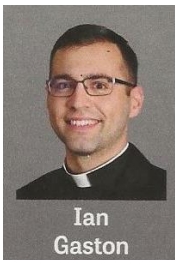
Dear Brother Knights,

Message from Your Council.....Recorder



My Brothers,

Hebrews 6:18-19 "hold fast the hope set before us which we have as an anchor for the soul". We are living in tumultuous times and there are many days where the upside down world that we are living through only seems to become more foreign. We as Catholic men are often overwhelmed by the needs of our families and friends. Everyone we know seems to be going through some struggle. Prayer lists are long and we place our trust in God, but it does not always bring the comfort that we desire.

The symbol of the anchor was an early Christian symbol of faith. It came to prominence between 100 AD and 300 AD and reflected the lives of the early Christians who needed to hold steadfast onto their Faith in Christ in the midst of turmoil and persecution. The Stock and Shank of the anchor also form a cross and it is evident that early Christians understood the significance of transforming the cross from an instrument of torture and execution into a symbol of hope and salvation. *Source: Catholic answers.com, NewAdvent.com. EWTN.com*

The church today has many gifts that we may seek out as anchors to hold on as the storms pass over us. Attending Mass as often as we can, receiving the Eucharist in a state of Grace, and seeking reconciliation when we have fallen. The beauty of sitting in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Praying the Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet, reading the Scriptures and letting the words heal our soul and refresh us. We as Knights also have our Fraternity as an anchor. Our instinct is to hold worries close to the vest and not allow others to know or help. But as members of the Body of Christ and further connected by the bonds of Fraternity, your Brother Knights can be another anchor to cling to while our ships are being tossed around by the world around us.

I encourage all of us to get to know our brothers on a deeper, more personal level so that when we do see each other that we know what is happening in one another's lives. When we don't see a member regularly we might have a sense that they need us and have not simply fallen away. Strengthening these bonds makes serving next to our Brother Knights even more joyful and gratifying.

RETREAT, AN INSIDE SCOOP

Dr. Dan traced deep philosophical and theological developments in the New and Old Testaments. I was glad to have taken a senior nap after lunch for such a heavy study. His most touching story took place in 1975 when Dr. Dan was an Army officer at the last U.S. offensive attack in Vietnam. Suddenly, a grenade landed in a foxhole near young Dan (21 years old) and other soldiers. Dr. Dan became very emotional as he described what happened next! Another soldier jumped into the foxhole and threw himself on the grenade. By the grace of God the grenade didn't explode! 50 years later Dr. Dan still dreamed of the incident and wondered why the soldier offered his life for his brothers. Was he Jesus for Dr. Dan and the others? Our storyteller quipped that the Vietcong who threw the grenade was probably as nervous as his U.S. enemies and forgot to pull the pin.

We had personal time in the afternoon to reflect or pray or walk or study until mass at 5 pm. Fr. Bruno said mass, a memorial of St. Thomas Aquinas, the greatest Dominican theologian in Christianity. The rest of St. Thomas' story was most interesting. His family was wealthy and opposed to his plan to join the newly formed Dominican Order. They even kidnapped him and tried to seduce him with a prostitute! Thomas was a holy man determined to dedicate himself to God's service. His mom relented and allowed him to slip out a back entrance to their home. Fr. Bruno in his homily reminded us that every Christian at baptism becomes priest, prophet, and king leading others to Christ.

Dinner at 6 pm consisted of ribs, mashed potatoes, al dente carrots, green salad, flan for desert, and fresh water. Our prayer service at 7:30 pm involved live music from Paul playing an electric piano in the chapel and singing, along with Dr. Michael Cunningham reflecting on us travelling to Emmaus accompanied by Jesus, not hiding from God, and trusting Him to forgive us. He focused on the three retreat questions. After a 15 minute adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, we departed to our rooms to rest.

At 7 am Sunday Bob awakened us with his hallway bell ringing. After a short morning prayer in the chapel, we dined on scrambled eggs, pancakes with syrup, fresh fruit, small Canadian bacons, and coffee. After that we packed all our room linens in plastic bags. At 9:15 am Fr. Bruno led our last conference and Wrap-up. He joked about a lady named Edna who desperately prayed to win the lotto but forgot to buy a ticket. He recounted the numerous activities at Mater Dolorosa and asked us to pray for them.

Mass at 11:30 am began with Paul starting to teach us some songs. We loudly sang “Happy Birthday Paul” instead, because Dr. Cunningham told us earlier that yesterday was his birthday. Paul, a single parent, was overwhelmed and had to sit on stairs leading to the altar for a few minutes. Fr. Febin presided at mass and reflected on our retreat themes. He said our prescription for a joyful life on Earth and beyond was in Matthew’s Gospel reading today of the beatitudes. Carlos drove Rick and me safely home. We all hoped to carry Jesus with us back into our homes and the world!
