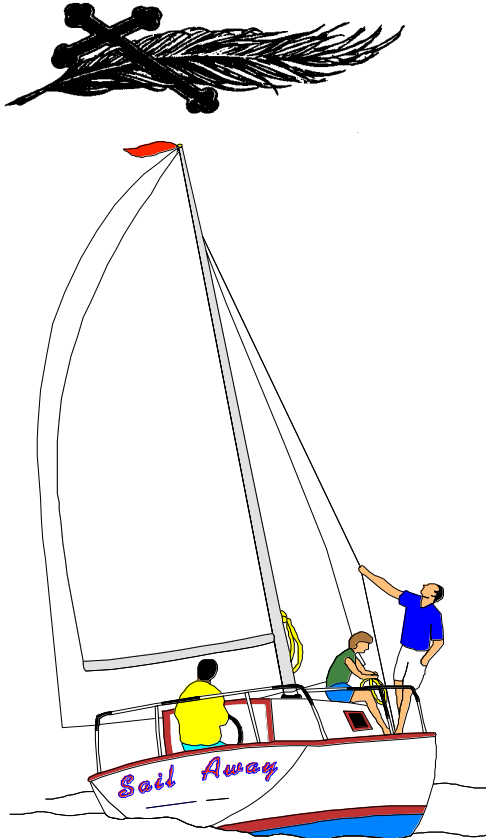



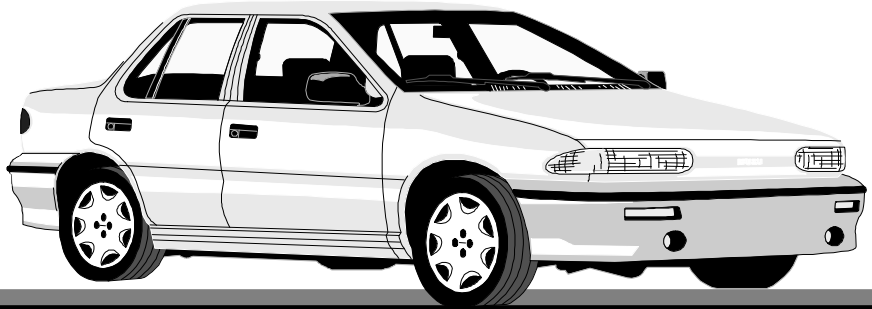
Thanks to all of you for the vote of confidence and allowing me to serve as your Grand Knight for the new Columbian Year.

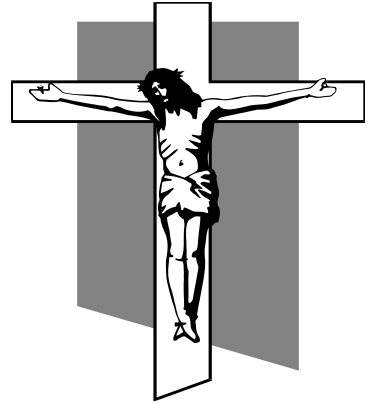

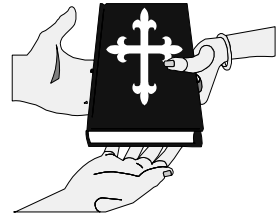

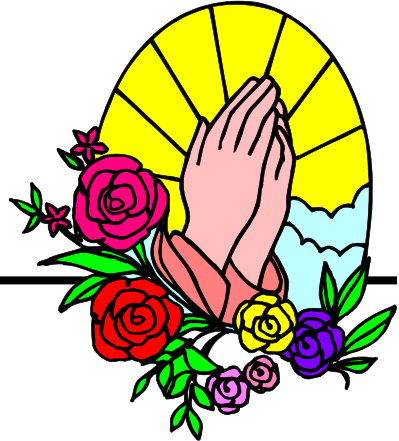
Summer 2016 is almost over. I hope that everybody had a nice celebration of our nation's independence.

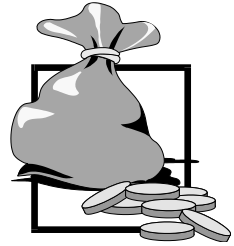
Adoration

I was thinking during our July business meeting when our Insurance Advisor Dan del Villar was speaking.

In my misspent youth about Fifty Five years ago I was in short order, a teacher, a systems engineer and an insurance salesman, all for \$500.00 a month. Part of insurance is to pay claims. My first was for a death. A young man had been beheaded in a motorcycle accident. The widow was on a couch in her father's home as I paid the \$10,000.00 due. A month later I was back with another \$10,000.00 because of the double indemnity clause in the plan. She now had a new car in her driveway that she needed.

My only other payout was for a death to a widow of about sixty years of age. She was thrilled when she received the \$650.00 death benefit. She had it all planned, with those funds she could get her club feet operated on allowing her to get her first job in a ten cent store.

As Brother George Kubeck talked about his experience's pointed out during the meeting, insurance can have real value.

Pope Francis asked us all to show mercy especially in this Year of Mercy. In the pew at St. Irenaeus I found the pamphlet "Works of Mercy." Under Spiritual Works it lists Comfort the Sorrowful. I quote, "Sorrow and suffering take many forms: death, divorce, grave illness, unemployment, family problems, mental distress, surgery, etc. How many of these sorrows afflict the people around us and yet go unnoticed without so much as a kind word, without so much as a whispered prayer? Maybe telling the government I can't do that like the Little Sister of The Poor have done. Maybe telling family or friends you can't be part of what they are doing. A drug dealer would say "I'm just trying make a buck". That might be ok if you were not harming someone. The Abortionist is only trying to make a buck. I doubt the drug dealer or the abortionist really understand the harm they cause.

Protecting Your Family... Business?

A Founding Notion: Protecting the Breadwinner's Income

While jobs may be safer in 2016, accidents, injuries, and illnesses that can impact your ability to work still happen. Most, in fact, do not happen on the jobsite or place of employment. Did you know that a 2011 study revealed that more than 95 percent of the long-term disability claims on file were not work related?

The Knights have always sought to protect members' families from the "loss" of a breadwinner. I'm sure you know all about Father McGivney's vision for our insurance program. But you may not know that Father McGivney also wanted to find a way to help members who couldn't work because of an illness. After all, the "loss" of the breadwinner does not have to mean that person's death; it can also mean the loss of the breadwinner's income.

Consider that loss for a moment. How would your family fare if a source of income suddenly stopped? Could a dual-income family manage on one income? What about young families with a working father and a mother who cares for the children? What if his income halted due to an accident or illness?

I've heard some people say they have coverage at work, but too many aren't sure what this coverage entails, how much income it would provide or for how long. Having this protection counts for something, certainly, but it isn't "yours"; it's provided by the company for which you work at their discretion. It could be eliminated tomorrow.

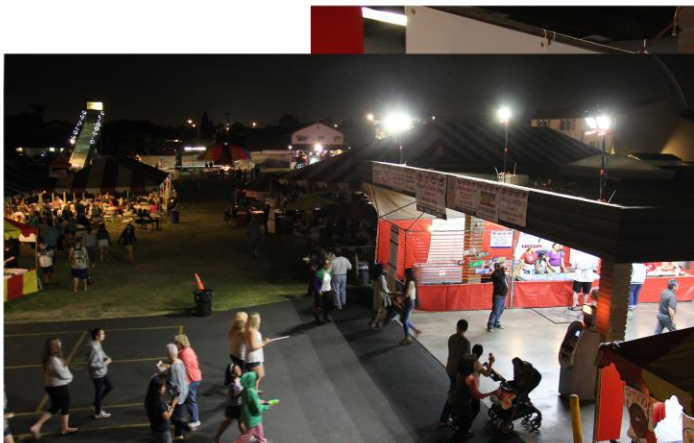
