As I mentioned earlier, we fell short of our new member's goal. Continue our individual efforts of finding and inviting new members. Mention all of our charity work and our support of the church.

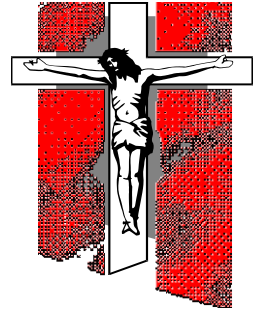

How heartbreakingly sad is it when you've had so many abortions you can rank them and decide which one was your "best?"

In *New York Magazine's The Cut* on June 19, Sarah Miller wrote about the four abortions she's had and which was her "best abortion ever." The article is brutally honest to the point of being cavalier about abortion. There was absolutely no discussion of if she was using birth control or how she found herself pregnant four times in 16 years when she knew she didn't want to be a mother.

Miller's first abortion was in the early 1990s when she was 24. She described a terrible experience afterwards, "clutching my abdomen in pain." She didn't say when her next abortion was, just that it wasn't as bad but she still "felt like shit and bled and bled and bled, for days."

In 2011, for her third abortion, Miller took the abortion pill which, she described, "covered all the bases of physical misery: I bled. I was nauseous. I had cramps. I could not get comfortable. I couldn't read. I couldn't watch TV. I could only thrash around and fail to imagine ever feeling better."

After that terrible experience with RU-486, she found herself pregnant again – for the fourth time in her life and the second time that year – and decided on a surgical aspiration abortion.

Miller was going to go under general anesthesia but the abortion facility receptionist assured her, "We've gotten wayyyyyy better at abortions," and "**The woman who works on Tuesdays is amazing.**" When Miller agreed, the woman got downright creepy:

She looked so happy. She actually said yay, as she tapped my file on the counter. "**This woman is seriously just so incredible at abortions,**" she said. "**I think you're really going to like it.**" REALLY going to like her "incredible" abortion!

For her final and "best" abortion, Miller described it as "like the worst cramp ever times three, but not worse than that." "Holy s—," she said to the abortionist. "**That was hands down the best abortion I ever had in my whole f—— life.** You're amazing."

But hidden behind that nonchalant attitude and expletive-laden enthusiasm for abortion is a lot of pain and brokenness.

Before her last abortion, Miller talked about how she started to cry thinking about how she was over 40, underemployed, with a partner who didn't care, and knowing their relationship was over. She was even considering having the baby, "*Maybe it could be my last chance of having someone love me.*"

Miller had all the same problems as before the abortion, but she felt an immediate rush after: *I'm not a failure, I thought, I have a pretty good car stereo, and I'm not pregnant, and I am not having cramps, and there is no blood in my underwear, not a speck.* I felt like the most successful, luckiest person alive.

No doubt this was a temporary high. If abortion had the ability to change and improve life for the better and solve a person's problems she wouldn't find herself repeatedly getting one. I hope someday Sarah Miller (and anyone post-abortive reading this) finds the [hope](#) and [healing](#) she so desperately needs.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION ON DAVID AND GOLIATH FROM FATHER MICHAEL HIGGINS AND DR. MICHAEL J. CUNNINGHAM OF MATER DOLOROSA PASSIONIST RETREAT CENTER

Many of us have favorite stories from Scripture. At least, I do. One of my favorites is the story of David and Goliath found in the First Book of Samuel. Clearly, I'm not the only one who savors this story as it is referenced again and again in situations in which there's one side who is powerful and one who is weak.

Perhaps you know the story well but let me summarize it. It tells of the confrontation between the grizzled, fearsome, Philistine warrior, Goliath, and the unscarred, inexperienced and perhaps even naïve, yet strangely confident young David. The context is the war between the army of the Philistines

and the army of Israel led by King Saul. Goliath, the champion of the Philistines, calls out any warrior of Saul's army that is brave enough to face him. The stakes are winner takes all. Saul, the King of Israel despairs at the challenge because he has no one of Goliath's caliber. He faces losing the war by default.

Up steps young David, inexperienced in war, untried in arms, but filled with faith in God's protection. Saul is grateful to David for stepping up to the challenge but tries to dissuade him from going out to meet Goliath. Saul is sure David will be killed. But Saul finally agrees to let David represent Israel because there is no one else and David is unafraid and filled with trust in God. The result of the encounter is familiar to us all. A smooth stone picked up from the riverbed, David's sling, and a well-placed hit on the forehead of Goliath. Stunned, Goliath falls. David walks up to him, takes Goliath's sword and decapitates him. A bloody ending its true, but a triumph for Israel.

While this story of David has heroic proportions and most of us don't feel much like heroes most of the time, it can still give us hope in our own life. Though the fate of a nation rarely depends on us, most of us do have real struggles and often seemingly unsurmountable difficulties in our lives. Let's face it, often we just don't know what to do in response to the challenges we face. Sometimes it can be our inability to please or even understand what's going on in members of our family. Or, it could be in dealing with a particularly difficult situation or person at work. Or, it could be figuring out how to deal with prickly political or social situations. We can even feel helpless in responding to world issues such as hunger, social injustice, racial prejudice, and violence. There are so many situations in our lives that are far beyond our capabilities. We don't know how to respond and sometimes doubt our ability even to survive.

At the very core of young David's ability to deal with the much stronger Goliath is his complete trust in God. Surely, if David had not had that trust, he would have hesitated to step forward. And, even if he were able to step up, it would have been very likely that his aim would have been less sure. Clearly, his calm and confidence and thus, his success was the result of his utter trust in God. His unimagined victory gives us courage.

Every time I think about this ancient story about David and Goliath, I wonder about my own trust in God. Do I trust that God is with me, even in the confusing and challenging situations in my life? Does David show the way? Is it a way that makes sense to me, here and now? How can I strengthen my conviction that God is with me?

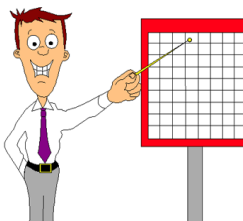
