

Witness of the Holy Spirit - Faith

Two thousand years ago Joseph and Mary came to Bethlehem and searched for a place to spend the night. Bethlehem was buzzing with activity. There was an elderly man named Simeon living in Jerusalem and God had assured him through the Holy Spirit that He would not die before he had seen the Messiah. Luke 2: 25-31 Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the comfort the Messiah would bring to His people at His coming. 
As we celebrate Christmas this year, let's pause to look at the Lord through eyes of faith. What we say is "seeing is believing" what God would say is "believing is seeing."

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR COUNCIL......RECORDER RESPECT LIFE, JUSTICE & PEACE CHAIRMAN

RESPECT LIFE, JUSTICE AND PEACE

As promised last month, here is the first Catholic Social Teaching (CST). U.S. Catholic Bishops feel that far too many Catholics are not familiar with the basic content of CST. Many Catholics do not adequately understand that the social teaching of the Church is an essential part of Catholic faith. Its roots are in the Hebrew prophets who announced God's special love for the poor and called God's people to a covenant of love and justice. Christ told us to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind (Luke 4: 18-19.) Catholic social teaching is built on a commitment to the poor. There are 7 major themes in CST.

THEME #1: LIFE AND DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON.

CST is based on and inseparable from our understanding of human life and human dignity. Every human being from the moment of conception to natural death is created in the image of God and redeemed by Jesus Christ and therefore is invaluable and worthy of respect as a member of the human family. Human dignity comes from God, not from any human quality or accomplishment.

In a world warped by materialism and declining respect for human life, the Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Our belief in the sanctity of human life and the inherent dignity of the human person is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. We reject society's attacks: abortion, assisted suicide, increased use of the death penalty, human cloning or proposals for genetic engineering to create "perfect" human beings. The measure of every institution is whether it threatens of enhances the life and dignity of the human person.




