

Advent is one of my favorite times of year. In the midst of all that swirls around us during this time of the year, the Church in her wisdom calls us to slow down, to open our hearts, to make straight our paths to the coming of the Christ. If you pause for a moment you can sense the groaning of humanity juxtaposed with the silence and whispering of Advent.

The days of Advent, much like the Holy Triduum at Easter inflame the spirit in my soul to a white hot love for Christ and his church. As a child I used to make paper chain calendars to count the days toward Christmas. Of course, I had no idea that I was creating an advent calendar but my parents cleverly encouraged me to create the calendar and remove a ring each night until Christmas Eve.

The ancient carol, "O Come, O Come Emanuel!" is based on ancient prayers called the "O Antiphons". These rich prayers can be prayed in the week prior to Christmas. The first letter of each of these prayers in Latin forms an acrostics which spells our Ero cras, which translates to "I will be (there) tomorrow" or "Tomorrow, I will come". The prayers are listed below for your reference. God Bless you. Have a blessed Advent and Christmastide. Thank you for all you do for the Knights. Your presence and your service is recognized and appreciated.

DECEMBER 17DECEO Wisdom of our God Most High,<br/>guiding creation with power and love:<br/>come to teach us the path of knowledge!O Lea

DECEMBER 19 O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay! **DECEMBER 18** 

O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

DECEMBER 20 O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

DECEMBER 21 O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

HATE OR LOVE? By Frank Faecke

On Monday, November 6, 2023, on Zoom, Benny asked, "What can we do (with such division worldwide)?" Most folks have heard of the Catholic Church's Crusades against Islamic forces who were conquering Christians worldwide. But not everyone has known the story of Giovanni in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century AD. Wikipedia told it to me.

He was born in 1181 and died on October 3, 1226 at 44 years-old. Giovanni was born to a rich silk merchant and lived his youth as a typical wealthy lad, who delighted in fine clothes and spent money lavishly. A beggar asking for alms in the marketplace touched his heart, moving Giovanni to empty his pockets to the man. Giovanni's dad scolded him in a rage for doing so.

In about 1202, Giovanni joined a military expedition against Perugia, but he was taken captive. A yearlong captivity coupled with illness caused him to re-evaluate his life. After release, however, he returned to a carefree life. In 1205 he enlisted in another army. A strange vision forced him to return home and lose interest in his worldly life.

He took a pilgrimage to Rome and joined the poor in begging at St. Peter's Basilica. After begging God for enlightenment, he encountered Jesus Christ through an icon in a forsaken country chapel. Jesus told him to "repair My church which, as you can see, is falling into ruins." He took the message literally and sold expensive cloth that he took without permission from his father's store. The local priest refused to take the money, because it came from ill-gotten gains.

Giovanni's father beat and locked up his son before finally giving up on him. Giovanni returned every item that he got from his father, including all of his clothes! A local bishop covered him with his own cloak. From then on his clothing became a simple brown monk's habit secured at the waist by a rope cord. After time spent communing with nature and living in a cave, Giovanni attracted a group of like-minded followers who begged for a living and sought to spread the Kingdom of Heaven on earth.

They rebuilt not only several ruined chapels but the entire Catholic Church! In 1219, Giovanni and a brave friar from Arce went to Egypt. During a cease fire between Christians and Muslims, Giovanni and his companion crossed Muslims' lines and were brought before the Sultan of Egypt, al-Kamil, a nephew of Saladin.

They remained in his camp for a few days. The Sultan received Giovanni graciously and admired his courage. Although he preached to the Muslims, Giovanni came to admire their devotion to God, called Allah, and their prayers five times a day. He returned unharmed. In 1267 sources reported that the Sultan secretly converted or accepted a death-bed baptism as a result of meeting Giovanni.

By now you may have guessed the name by which we know Giovanni, that is, Saint Francis of Assisi. I believe he did more good in relations between Christians and Muslims than all the Crusades!

Recently, I was assisting my friend Liz, who uses a walker, cross the street safely from St. Irenaeus Church to her home. As I spoke to her about the story of St. Francis and the Sultan, she had her own story. Years ago Liz was a Navy nurse working in Paediatrics. Several of the women there were Muslim, and they wanted a female doctor to deliver their child. Liz noted that there was a shortage of female doctors available. She took it upon herself to contact the husband of a Muslim female patient who spoke no English and was troubled.

When the husband saw Liz's crucifix around her neck, he said, "I believe I can trust you." After hearing from Liz about the procedures, he explained everything to his wife, who was greatly relieved.

The approaches of St. Francis and Liz are the answer to Benny's question, "What can we do?" Jesus' command to love God with all our heart, soul, and will power and to love our neighbour as ourselves fulfils all the laws of Christians, Jews, Muslims and all!

Please join me brothers and sisters in saying the Prayer of St. Francis:

Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.

Where there is hatred, let me sow love.

Where there is injury, pardon;

Where there is doubt, faith.

Where there is despair, hope;

Where there is darkness, light;

and where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.
