





On Sunday, January 22, a 2^{nd} Degree was held at Fr. Kass Council, and congratulations to Leo Griego who is now a 2^{nd} Degree member. The next 2^{nd} Degree will be on Tuesday, February 7th at Holy Spirit in Fountain Valley




