



Ephesians 5:

31 "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh."- (Gen. 2:24)

33 however, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

1 Corinthians 11:

1 Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

An individual away from the Father, becomes isolated, builds up anger, is in desperate need of love, can be easily manipulated, and is a dangerous weapon in motion.

By understanding this and looking around us, the world, countries, societies, communities, families, our interior lives; it helps us understand a little, the reality of the world we live in and the effects of families without a father figure.

But, we might ask ourselves, what can we personally do to stop this pattern of worldly destruction? How and where can we start?

Each of us can start by claiming and owning our mission in this life, (husband, father, brother, son), with faithful commitment; and solving with humility our own relationship with our Father, our God. We can start by living what sacred scriptures tells us about the family. We can start with us, in our own families, where our faith begins. Thursday, June 12, 2020 was a little cooler than previous days. I awoke early after daybreak and began saying my rosary as I started coffee brewing. My favorite mysteries, Luminous, guided me as I began to wake up. Lured by the delicious smell of fresh coffee, I arose, grabbed a cup and turned on sprinklers in the front yard. I thanked God for a good sleep and entered into quiet time in His presence.

My beginning daily prayers took only 20 minutes: Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary; prayers through St. Joseph, Archangels Rafael and Michael, St. Padre Pio, St. Francis of Assisi, Mother Mary (7 Sorrows), Holy Popes and saints. Teresa has cut my hair for years and is better than any barber I have had. She was born in Mexico and migrated to the USA. Her husband is still waiting to return to his construction job. She shared that she had been up since 4 AM cooking for her family and cutting hair all day long. This joyful, hard-working immigrant is part of our country's backbone. I imagined her as Mother Mary working night and day to care for her family!

After sharing a delicious meal with my family, I read, watched a little TV, joined in our evening family prayer, and called it a night. Before dozing off for delicious sleep, I thanked God for good health, holy friends and family, a blessed retirement, and this special day. Thanks for reading!

"Fact Check"?

Alexandra DeSanctis of *National Review* pointed out the silliness of what they call a "Fact Check" these days. "Checking" an opinion piece on LifeNews.com headlined "Baby Born Alive at 23 Weeks Was Gasping for Air. Abortion Clinic Put Baby in a Bag, Threw Her in the Trash."

Or as DeSanctis summarized answer by "Fact Check"




