### 2022 PASSION PLAY OBERAMMERGAU By FRANK FAECKE



On Thursday, May 19, 2022, at 1:30 pm, my wife Julie and I passed through pat down security checks, one for women and another for men, before entering the Passion Theatre. We were excited to be part of an audience of 4,000 in the little village 45 minutes south of Munich, Germany. I learned the Passion play's history from a book entitled *2022 Passion Play Oberammergau*, a complete translation of the play from German to English.

It contained the following forward about the Character of the Play: "The Oberammergau Passion Play is a very special play. It all started with a vow. In 1633, the plague was raging in Europe, including in the town of Oberammergau. People sought refuge in prayer and vowed: If the dying stops, every ten years we will stage the 'play of the passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.' And in fact, no one died of the plague from that day on. Since then, the people of Oberammergau have been performing the Passion of Jesus Christ every ten years. #### 2022 Passion Play Oberammergau – Continued from pg. 10

For 200 years, the play was staged on the cemetery near the church. However, in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, when more and more people started coming from all over the world to see the play, it was moved to the place where the Passion Theatre (built in 1900) stands today. While there are manifold reasons why so many people want to see the play, one reason certainly has to do with the special character of the play. It revolves around the mystery of the Passion of Jesus in a dramatic as well as a meditative way.

Between scenes, moments from the Old Testament come alive as theatrical depictions of related situations from earlier times. They also serve as meditative points of reflection throughout the play. As in 2000 and 2010, these living pictures for 2022 were designed and organized by Stefan Hageneier who also designed the costumes and had the stage rebuilt to achieve stylistic unity....Due to the pandemic, the performance had to be postponed from 2020 to 2022."

From this fine book on the Passion Play, I learned that it is continually updated to be meaningful for today's audience. The priest advisor in Munich consults with Jewish authorities to keep it from being anti-Semitic. Protestant leaders have their input into the play as well.

As we got to know some of the 116 other Viking Cruise guests, we met Catholics, Protestants, and Non-Denominational believers who wanted to share this dramatic presentation by some of the 3,000 residents of Oberammergau. From 2:30 pm to 5 pm we sat spellbound three rows from the enormous stage at the most magnificent presentation of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday through His arrest in Gethsemane. We then shared an included dinner with our fellow theatregoers from 5 pm to 7 pm. Again we passed through security screening, and I began to see some priests and nuns in the crowd.

From 8 pm to 10:30 pm, we enjoyed the polished, dedicated men, women, and children choir and main characters. The stage was covered but shortly after 8 pm, we heard and saw through the glass covering the sky filled with a downpour of rain. The small orchestra was in perfect tune. We felt the tension earlier as a real donkey stepped onto the stage carrying Jesus into Jerusalem, and later huge horses entered the stage carrying Roman soldiers and Pontius Pilate. The choir and actors deftly skirted around a pile of droppings left by one of the horses.

Jesus' scourging and crowning with thorns looked real as His precious blood began to fall. Cruel soldiers appeared to actually nail His hands and feet to the enormous cross. Jesus, with a criminal to His left and one to His right, hung high above the stage and spoke only love from the Cross. After the two criminals' legs were broken and Jesus' side pierced with a lance, all were taken down from their crosses. Jesus' body was carefully taken down in an enormous white sheet.

Following a poignant burial scene, the women came to His tomb, where and angel told them: "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, he has risen." The Risen Lord appeared briefly. Mary of Magdala announced: "I know that my Savior lives!" The play and the rain were over. We quietly trooped to our bus for travel to our quaint hotel and a peaceful night's sleep.
