



Dear Brother Knights: In the book Voter's Guide for Serious Catholics it has chapter on Abortion. It states the following information.

The church teaches that, regarding a law permitting abortion, it is "never licit to, or to take part in propaganda campaign in favor of such a law, or to vote for it". Abortion is the intentional and direct killing of an innocent human being, and therefore it is a form of homicide. The unborn child is always an innocent party, and no law may permit the taking of his life, even when a child is conceived through rape or incest, the fault is not the child's, who should not suffer death for others 'sins

Let me put it this way. Abortion is intrinsically evil and should never be promoted. The killing of Jews was legal in Gemany. The killing of the unborn in is legal in this country. 


