
The Grand Knight and Trustee Bill Serb attended the Knights of Columbus State Convention in San Diego in May and have come back with some very constructive ideas for our Council.

Cover Two People With One Policy

In this month's article, I want to discuss a type of life insurance product with which you might not be familiar. 


