Why "Good" Friday

There was a lot of controversy about the origin of Good Friday. Some say it goes back as far as 100AD. Others say it was well into the fourth century before "passion week" was ever observed. Regardless of when it was started why do we call it "Good" Friday? After all, our Lord died on a cross that day why not call it "Sad" Friday or "Terrible" Friday. For that answer all we need to do is focus on what really happened on that day in history. The sins of the world were paid for! Praise the Lord. Isaiah 53:10 talks about Jesus being a guilt offering and that He bore the sins of many, He made intercession for the transgressors. On that day Jesus took on the iniquities of us all. (Isaiah 53: 6.) It was dark from noon until 3pm. (Matthew 27:45) "*From the sixth hour until the ninth hour darkness came over the land." 
March 13 is the Monthly 24 hour Adoration at the church. Spend at least one hour of quiet conversation with our Lord Jesus Christ.

LENT=LOVE

The purpose of Lent (and Life) is to learn how to love by drawing nearer to the Greatest Love, Jesus Christ. On January 31 we heard St. Paul eloquently describe Love (1 Corinthians 12-13.) Let me lead you on a short journey I took last year with brother knight George Mergl (died February 5, 2016,) and his precious wife Betty.

Brother Ken Peterson mentioned that George, who suffered a stroke, would like Holy Communion, and Betty invited me to come. Tuesday mornings we shared Communion, amazing stories of grace, and the best coffee and sweets I have ever tasted. (Betty turned down a job once baking for a restaurant.) Through their exceptional hospitality, I came to learn of their service to the family, their neighborhood, the K of C, and St,. Irenaeus. Jesus led me to look at love in action.

George was always patient and kind as he shared his amazing escape from certain execution in the former Yugoslavia in WWII. Their idyllic village was turned upside down by the Nazis, then the Communists. I too had to be patient as his story unfolded. Betty and some of her family survived a Communist Concentration Camp after the war. Neither George nor Betty were vindictive or seeking their own interests. They did not brood over terrible injury. They bore with all things, migrated to the U.S.A., learned English from scratch, and contributed so much to St. Irenaeus, the K of C, and every community they touched.

Betty took care of St. I's kindergartners for over 20 years, even when the trailer that housed the children was threatened by flood. George took care of Mother's Day flowers for at least 5 years, made the flowers prettier, and introduced corsages.

Brother Lloyd Duronslet will never forget when he took on the Phone Captain job, and George stepped forward to help him.

I am sure stories abound of George's service to the K of C. George and Betty were some of the first Eucharistic Ministers at St. Irenaeus. They knew their neighbors and helped them in projects and brought goodies that Betty made. She make prayer shawls to comfort the sick and grieving. In front of the Long Beach Planned Parenthood, I have handed out tiny booties Betty made. You should have seen the joy in mothers' eyes when they chose to keep their babies and have their babies' first "shoes."


