

Ubuntu

An Anthropologist proposed a game to the African tribal children....He placed a basket of sweets near a tree and had the children stand 100 meters away. He then told them that whoever reaches the sweets first would get the whole basket. He was amazed that after he said “ready, set, go” they didn’t even hesitate. They immediately held hands and ran together to the tree so that they all touched it at the same time. They were able to divide the sweets equally among themselves and then set down together and enjoy it. When the Anthropologist asked them why they did it that way, they answered “Ubuntu.” Which in their language means, “How can one be happy when others are sad?” Actual translation is “I am because we are!”

If we could have that same attitude, always help others and share happiness wherever we go, what a different world this would be. 



March 23rd. Fish Fry (last one). Doors open at 5:00 PM.


Note: During our last Fish Fry of the year is when we will be drawing the name of the Maui Hawaiian vacation winner.





A Message From Your Council.....Recorder & Respect Life, Justice & Peace Chairman



LENT=SPRINGTIME

Last month I reflected on our Men's Retreat at Mater Dolorosa as our preparation for Lent. Now that we are in the midst of Lent, I highly recommend that you read Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori's article "A Spiritual Springtime" in the February 2018 issue of **COLUMBIA** magazine.

At St. Irenaeus we have many opportunities for prayer, the first Lenten Practice. I am already noticing more folks attending daily mass. Several groups recite the rosary and other prayers together, for example, as monthly Adoration begins. We have our quarterly parish retreat in March and Stations of the Cross each Friday in Lent. All these group prayers can lead us to deeper quiet, personal prayer and reflections on Sacred Scripture. All this in turn leads us to the Confessional and a humble look at ourselves. Through Christ's forgiveness, with the priest as minister, we taste God's infinite Mercy!

A second Lenten Practice, fasting or self-denial, takes us out of ourselves to look around us and see the needs of our loved ones and our brothers and sisters in Christ. When we focus too much on ourselves we miss what God wants us to do for others. I spent just a couple of weeks many years ago when I was in college visiting Solidarita (translated "Lonely Little Village") near Morelia, Mexico. We got to make bricks at Christmas for a church they planned to build in the summer. The priest was a former U.S. soldier whose heart was touched by his being stationed in Mexico and seeing the need for a shepherd. I was able to live among loving people who had no running water and electricity for only a short time during the day. Many had come to the United States illegally to earn money to feed and clothe their families. They were not criminals, and they were very grateful and hospitable to us. That short experience has lasted a lifetime for me.

The final Lenten practice of almsgiving follows from the first two. Again, we have so many opportunities at St. Irenaeus. Each month we are called to help bag groceries on one day and distribute them on another day through HOPE, which helps the less fortunate. Come to a Friday Fish Fry to support the organizations we knights partner with and the charities we assist. Donate your used car, boat, plane, etc. to our Vehicle Donation Program. We have received over forty vehicles and have donated well over \$12,000 to St. Irenaeus Church and School and HOPE through our generous donors.

I truly hope and pray that your Lent is going well, and as Archbishop Lori wishes us, a Spiritual Springtime!


