“FIXERS”

Many reality shows are unreal and not worth watching. During this just past Black History month, including Valentine’s Day, my wife Julie found two amazing reality programs on BYU (Mormon Channel) called the “Fixers” and the life story of St. Josephine Bakhita.

The Fixers are three men and one woman. This reality series follows experienced contractors who travel the world “to accomplish life-changing and sustainable projects that affect entire communities for the better.” We found it worth watching.

On Wednesday, February 3, 2021, we saw the Fixers tackle a project for Ruby Dove in Pine Bluff, Arkansas. Ruby was widowed in 2000, left her schoolteacher job, and founded a community outreach program called TOPPS to keep black youth out of gangs and healed. She bought a dilapidated house for \$5,000 in a crime-ridden area and converted it into a community center. Ruby’s grown son and daughter have helped her mentor 35 to 50 children at a time, tutoring them after school and building up their self-esteem. 98% of her students have graduated from high school and gone to college. Beautiful, intelligent, well-spoken young black individuals spoke into the camera telling stories of overcoming life without a father and their goals of succeeding in business, becoming a lawyer, etc.

The Fixers, with help from a large pool of young volunteers, did everything from roof and floor repair to complete restoration of the house and yard. The yard sported a new playground. The study room was lined with desks attached to the walls complete with new computers. The tiny kitchen was expanded to become a modern, completely furnished kitchen. Positive, beautifully designed signs were posted on walls. The transformation was simply amazing! Ruby and her staff and students were wide-eyed and teary as they stepped into their new center. Tears were in the eyes of the Fixers too.

On Wednesday, February 10, 2021, we watched the Fixers turn a former barbershop in total disrepair into the new headquarters of “Concerned Black Men of Los Angeles” in a low income, high crime area. CBMLA’S stated mission is “to unite African American men to support and empower youths and advocate for the betterment of our communities.” Donations for the project came from Good360. Corporate donations included laptops and a flat screen television to be used in their youth program.

At the Los Angeles project the Fixers had to deal with COVID-19 restrictions. After a couple of days, they had to work daily in two twelve hour shifts to complete the job in a week. The exhausting project provided a completely restructured building with a basketball court behind it. The two black gentlemen who founded CBMLA, were totally overwhelmed with their new headquarters! The Fixers took on one of their greatest challenges and helped transform life for all involved.

On Saturday, February 13, 2021, we viewed the second of two segments on EWTN describing the life of St. Josephine Bakhita, emancipated slave and nun (1869-1947.) As a child, she was kidnapped from her village in southern Sudan and sold into slavery. She was owned by different masters who brutalized her. Bakhita's back was covered with scars from beatings. She finally found love in an Italian family who took her to Italy. Bakhita, whose name meant "Lucky," didn't want to return with that family to slavery in Sudan. An Italian court freed her from slavery. Her deep trust in God and her love for the outcast of society led to miracles through her prayers. She was baptized by her close priest friend and became a nun in the order of sisters who had protected her. Sister Josephine Bakhita lived to the age of seventy-eight, doing simple jobs such as cooking, sewing, and serving as doorkeeper. She deeply touched the lives of all who knew her. Bakhita died on February 8, 1947 and was canonized in 2000, the first native saint of Sudan.

My heart pounded and my eyes wept for joy during all these shows. As I reflected on Black History, I became convinced that civil unrest and violence accomplish only more hatred and division. The genuine love lived by the Fixers and their benefactors and St. Bakhita is the solution to most of our problems. When love flows forth from us to our neighbors, an unstoppable wave of true and lasting peace permeates our hearts, our homes, and our world! May we all become Fixers.

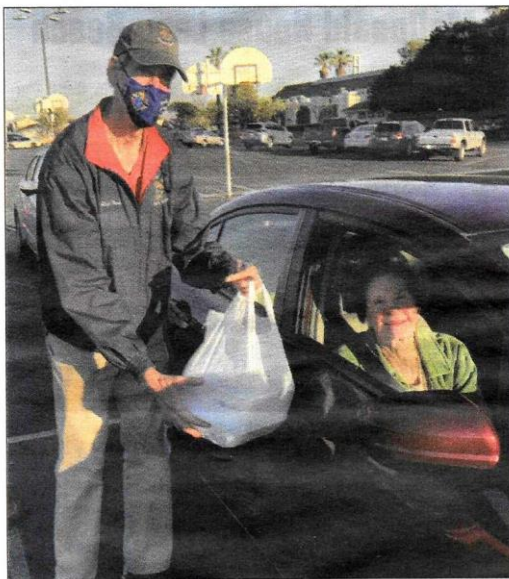

TRIBUTE TO HECTOR RUBIO

Frank Faecke and I had the privilege of learning Christian Pro-Life action from the best. His name was Hector Rubio. Hector was one of the most devout Catholic men we had ever met. Consider this. Hector retired as a teacher at Banning High School. Instead of kicking back and enjoying his much deserved retirement, he spent the next twenty plus years in front of abortion facilities trying to help women keep their precious babies. He had a routine. After daily 6:30 AM mass, he would take his Rosary and what he called his "Album of Life" to the "abortion mill." Then he'd pray the rosary and compassionately plead with the women to let him help them keep their babies. And it worked. I personally witnessed mothers bringing their babies back later and thanking Hector for his help. They even took photos of their babies with him. The photos of the saved babies made up his Album of Life. He used the Album to inspire other mothers to do the same. Hector and I because of health issues have retired, but Brother Frank has now inspired me to join with the Forty Days For Life Organization that are doing the same work that Hector so lovingly started. Forty Days also boasts of saving many precious unborn lives. Frank and I are unable to go to the abortion mills as we used to, but we can still offer daily Chaplets, Rosaries, and the most powerful and perfect Sacrifice of the Mass daily for ending the abortion scandal. 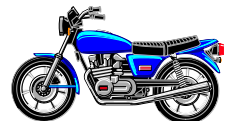

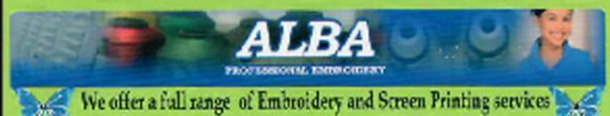
