Supreme Council hosted a first ever online Exemplification Ceremony, which now incorporates the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Degrees all together. 

Abortion Activists Face Lawsuit after Kicking, Shoving and Harassing Peaceful Pro-Lifers TOM CIESIELKA - BRISTOL, TENNESSEE

Pro-life advocates in Bristol, Tennessee are under attack, and the Thomas More Society is intervening on their behalf. In January 2020 the not-for-profit national public interest law firm helped file multiple petitions for orders of protection against members of a radical pro-abortion organization.

The offenders have harassed and threatened numerous pro-life individuals outside of the Bristol Regional Women's Center abortion facility in recent months. The aggressors have recently directed their attacks on Erika Schanzenbach, a peaceful pro-life witness and sidewalk counselor. Now, with the help of the Thomas More Society, Schanzenbach is fighting back, going to court to get protective orders against her most egregious abusers.

Thomas More Society Counsel Michael McHale explained that the offenders have often sought out Schanzenbach for harassment wherever she stands, even when she remains across the street from the abortion facility to avoid confrontation. The offenders subject Schanzenbach to a variety of abuses, including surrounding her and blocking her from view with large, open umbrellas; licking her arms; following her very closely wherever she walks – even back to her vehicle hundreds of feet away from the abortion facility; stealing and destroying her leaflets; and hurling profanities, taunts, and obscene gestures directly in her face.

"These actions are blatantly illegal, and they are unacceptable in a civilized society," McHale said. "Everyone has the right to peacefully advocate their beliefs on public streets and sidewalks without being bullied into silence. While we continue to ask local authorities to stop this illegal abuse, we are eager to help Ms. Schanzenbach secure some measure of relief in civil court."

These abusers boast online about their illegal conduct, identifying themselves as "Pro-Choice Bristol." Their Facebook-posted "Pink Manifesto" states that they will "use any means necessary to physically block" pro-life witnesses "from sight" and will do "anything at all not being enforced equally for the protection of patients whether demonstrably legal or not." The radical group also declares that "When local government fails" it will "step in."

Schanzenbach has been on the receiving end of harassment, abuse, and stalking by Denise Skeen, along with Denise's adult daughters, Alethea and Rowan. Each is named as a respondent in petitions for court orders of protection. Also named is Cheryl Hanzlik, who on multiple occasions has attempted to cause permanent hearing damage by pointing a bullhorn blaring loud police siren sounds directly into Schazenbach's face. Supplemental court complaints have also been filed against Hanzlik and Alethea Skeen for ongoing illegal harassment.

Along with McHale, Schanzenbach is also being represented by Thomas More Society Senior Counsel Martin Cannon and local counsel Andrew Fox. After the initial January 2020 court hearing, the cases will return to court in April 2020. At that time Schanzenbach's legal team will present substantial video evidence and live witness testimony demonstrating the ongoing abuse against her.

"Ms. Schanzenbach has been terrorized while exercising her freedom to peacefully express her opinion," McHale declared. "She has been stalked, threatened, and frightened, while attempting to share life-affirming alternatives with abortion-minded women – something that she is fully within her Constitutional rights to do," he added. "We expect the court to protect Ms. Schanzenbach to the full extent of the law."

NO GREATER GIFT By Frank Faecke



On Good Friday I share my thoughts. It is 2020, a year as Dickens said is the best of times and the worst of times. The bad/worst is easy to find. Every publication screams of the thousands stricken by the Corona virus and the many that die from it. Schools, entertainment places, restaurants, public gathering spots, and houses of worship have locked their doors. We all wait to hear of a cure for this merciless virus that has flown about the world.

What about the best? Up until this day I have attended daily mass broadcast by Word On Fire from Santa Barbara, California. There Bishop Robert Barron and Father Stephen, CEO of Word On Fire, have shared their celebration of daily mass from the bishop's small chapel. The over 200,000 viewers can receive spiritual communion with Jesus at mass. The priests' reflections on sacred scripture have been deep and powerful! It has been food for the soul for my wife Julie and me.

I believe these days have provided a retreat for the whole world, a time to withdraw from the world and draw close to family and dear friends and to reflect on what is really true and important. Julie and I have seen a couple of moving programs on Public Television, One has been an ongoing study of Sacred Places all around the world. It seems that all people on earth have special places where thousands and even millions of folks gather to worship God or gods whom they revere. I asked myself if they really believe in a spiritual being or beings and build magnificent structures. You bet!

Another film took us to August 1945, when Windermere, England became a place of redemption for 300 Jewish orphans. Two docudramas told the story of a wealthy, determined British man who restored them to life and later helped 700 more. He had already witnessed children who survived Nazi concentration camps, and his heart went out to them. By successfully lobbying the British government and with the help of a charity this man brought together adult survivors of the Holocaust to help the children. The team included a Jewish psychiatrist, a Rabbi, a married couple, and an art teacher/therapist who was a friend of Anna Freud. That group hired a kind Scottish man to coach the boys in soccer.

We saw an old photograph in the film of a train car loaded with the orphan children before they came to England. It was taken just after they had been liberated by Russians. The children were slated to have been executed the next day by Nazi troops. The first 300 children ranged in age from three to teens. All had been ravaged by godless German soldiers and most had lost all relatives in the Final Solution.

These precious, broken children were flown from Europe to an airport near Windermere, an abandoned secret site where seaplanes had been constructed in a factory during the war. It was a wooded area with a pristine lake and comfortable barracks. Some of the men and women who had been part of the Windermere experiment were still alive and interviewed in the film. They were in their 90s and told of going from Hell to Heaven during the four months spent at Windermere. After four months of schooling in English, eating healthy meals, getting plenty of exercise, and meeting lifelong friends, the children were placed with families.
