

VENTURA HOPE

I believe that many of us are looking for hope as the ravages of COVID-19 are lessening. The Easter theme of sermons by Pope Francis, Bishop Robert Barron, and our pastor, Father Binh Nguyen, was the hope surfacing after the long Lent of the Corona Virus. In his Easter morning homily, Father Binh spoke joyfully of being able to open St. Irenaeus Church to 50% capacity. His sharing was entirely positive and full of hope.

The day after Easter Sunday, my family and I took a short vacation. We drove just over two hours eighty miles to Ventura, CA. We parked for free in a city structure. We had time before check in at our motel; so we took a walking tour.

Just a few blocks away from us, we visited San Buenaventura Mission, one of the most beautiful of the California missions. Father Junipero Serra raised a cross on Santa Barbara Channel on Easter morning, March 31, 1782. He dedicated the mission named after Saint Bonaventure, a Franciscan, on September 9, 1809. The city name was later shortened to Ventura because of a railroad map, which abbreviated the full name.

We entered through the mission gift shop/museum, which was the main entry point of the old mission where visitors were welcomed. In the museum we marveled at enormous wooden bells encased in a glass cabinet. The bells were extremely rare and thought to have been struck by wooden sticks, not rung. Among the many artifacts left from years past was a small wooden confessional. In it was placed a monitor which played a documentary on Father Serra's life.

I learned that Father Serra voluntarily left a prestigious university professorship in Spain to evangelize in the New World. A brilliant man, he learned the indigenous language to share Good News. During his mission days, he walked hundreds of miles to what is now Mexico City to plead with his superior for a bill of rights to protect Indian converts, who were being abused by Spanish soldiers. On that journey, he was bitten by some insect. He suffered from that infection for the rest of his life.

The courtyard outside the museum was covered by green grass, shrubs, flowers, palm trees, and walk ways. The pleasant weather comforted us as we strolled past statues of saints, the Olive Press, and the Settling Tank. Padre Cambon, whom Father Serra left in charge of the mission, built an aqueduct seven mile long to bring San Buenaventura River water to the mission. English navigator George Vancouver called the flourishing orchards and gardens the finest he had ever seen.

After reading more mission history on illustrated signs, such as "Chumash Daily Life At The Mission," we reverently stepped into the long rectangular church, which still holds services. Remarkable paintings portrayed the Stations of the Cross and hung along the white walls. Beautiful wooden beams supported the roof. Beside the altar an enormous crucifix with the Suffering Christ hung on the left. A large painting of Our Lady of Guadalupe looked down on us from the right of the altar. The other end of the church had a room of sacred objects, including a tiny

relic from the "true cross." We also marveled at a cast marble statue of Michelangelo's Pieta, 73/100 scale made from a mold of the original, gifted to the mission in 2018. (Continued on Page 11)

We left the mission and explored more of Ventura on foot. Several streets were blocked off from traffic, allowing pedestrians to enjoy parks and sites. Museums and even the gleaming white marble city hall were still closed due to COVID-19. There were art works around, such as a panorama dedicated to the hardworking early Chinese settlers. We observed several homeless folks just hanging out, but we also walked past at least ten different thrift shops! One was even dedicated to helping abandoned/abused pets. I had never seen so many thrift stores in one small city! It seemed the people of Ventura really wanted to help everyone. One park had a giant Adirondack chair, which was across the street from a K of C hall.

We ate supper on Ventura Pier, the longest wooden pier in the USA. Having walked between 9,000 and 11,000 steps, we had no trouble falling asleep. Our motel was only 500 yards from the ocean and was very quiet, even though it was full of guests. The next morning we enjoyed our free breakfasts, which were safe and nutritious. The hard-working, friendly staff hosed off sidewalks and kept the place immaculately clean.

After breakfast we drove up a high hill behind city hall to Serra Cross, an enormous dark wooden beam structure honoring Father Serra's first cross. There was a nice grassy park around it, and several other tourists walked around wearing masks and enjoying the panoramic view of the entire city and the ocean. A cool ocean breeze swept over us on this sunny day. I was shocked by graffiti sprayed at the base of the cross. It read, "NO GOD...NO MASTERS...ONLY MACHINES." I said a silent prayer for the lost soul who painted the message and seemed to have no hope.

We spent most of our last full day hiking through the nearby Botanical Gardens and other trails in the area. Before the day ended, we drove a mile or two south of Ventura to the Channel Islands National Park Service Center and toured its museum. Only one company was sending boats to the Channel Islands, and all were booked. It seems that we missed the boat. We did enjoy walking around the harbor and scoping out both the large and tiny boats. A tiny beaten up silver boat had a sign which read, "Floggings will continue until morale improves!"

Our last stop was for supper. Back at our motel, my pedometer read 8,942 steps. After cards and trivia questions from our son, we all settled in for a cozy rest.

The next morning after another filling, delicious, nourishing breakfast, we checked out and hit the 101 Highway. Our joy was short-lived. About nine miles down the road while driving at 65, the speed limit, I suddenly came upon an aluminum stepladder, which I tried to straddle but clipped its edge. I stopped when safe and called 911. Someone had already reported it. We got back on the 101. A few minutes later, the truck next to us in the slow lane dropped a long metal pipe into his lane. Fortunately, he stopped on the shoulder. During our remaining safe trip home I reflected on all our blessings and the hope found in Ventura. I thanked our Guardian Angels and all the Holy Ones for their help!


