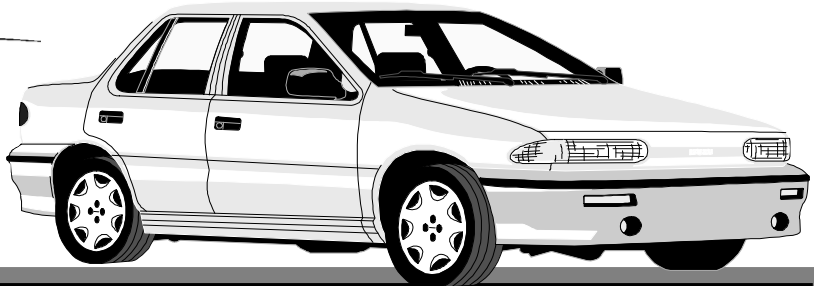
This is, as Knights of Columbus, we do without question, unconditionally, at any time.

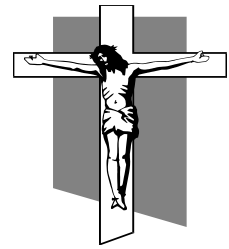

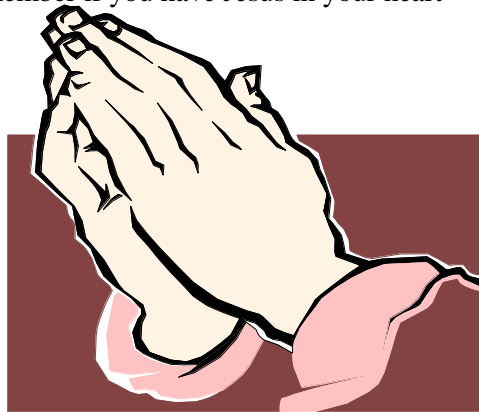

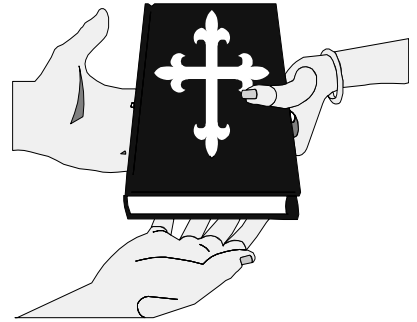
Adoration

Don't forget to vote on November 8 (Election Day).

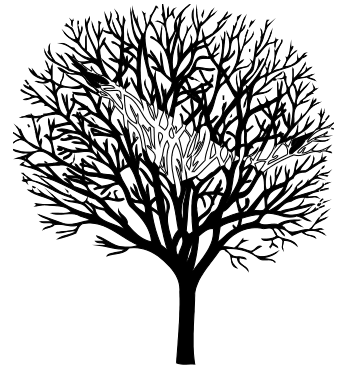

Thanks Giving

When Abraham Lincoln declared a national Thanksgiving Day he had suffered the death of his beloved son and the loss of thousands of precious souls in our Civil War. What in the world did he have to be thankful for? Yet he wanted us as a country to stop and give thanks for our many blessings despite our many mistakes and bad choices. Lincoln believed in a Supreme Being and wanted our country to give thanks as a nation for what we had.

A reflection came to me during a homily at Holy Family Catholic Church in Glendale, CA the morning after my eldest son Bill's wedding to Ronit, a wonderful lady who grew up in the Jewish faith. The priest shared how his spiritual director in the seminary told him to enter his reflection on all he had to be thankful for in his journal. He shared with us how he was a second generation immigrant to the USA and how much his parents had sacrificed for him. At that point in his spiritual development he claimed to have taken much for granted and had not stopped to thank God and others for all his blessings. The spiritual director asked only 5 minutes of his time to reflect on and record his blessings. That instruction was the beginning of a profound influence on his spiritual journey. It was a beautiful lesson for me after hearing the Gospel story of the one leper, a hated Samaritan, who returned to Jesus to give thanks for his healing and received a promise of salvation.

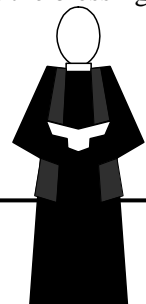

Reminder To Visit Senior Brothers

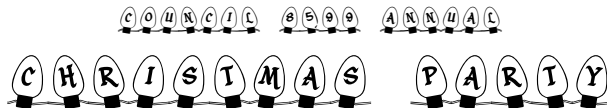
