





# A Message from Your Council.......Recorder & Respect Life, Justice & Peace Chairman



#### **BACK PAY**

In November 2019, Dr. Karen Evensen cleared me to give. I hadn't done this in years. I started in the 1960s but excused myself a few years ago even before my hip surgery by Dr. Evensen in November 2015. Interesting things had happened when I did it.

In the 1960s a donor exiting the parking lot couldn't get his token to open the wooden arm blocking the exit in Dallas, Texas where we were. We saw him get out of his car and snap off the wooden bar in anger. Blood began spurting from his arm! "Don't lift heavy objects for twenty-four hours," we had been told at Wadley Blood Center.

Years later I forgot that you have to be careful for twenty-four hours about activities. Once I tried to play softball with friends too soon and became really light-headed. I sat down to reflect on my foolishness. Sometime later I actually fainted right there after donating. How embarrassing! Real men don't faint. For the record, I think that was my only faint.

In late July 2020, I began researching through the American Red Cross. In 1628 British physician William Harvey discovered the circulation of blood. The first known blood transfusion was attempted soon afterward. In 1658 microscopist Jan Swammerdam observed and described red blood cells. The first recorded successful blood transfusion was in 1665 in England by Dr. Richard Lower, who kept a dog alive by transfusing blood from other dogs. Jean-Baptiste Denis in France and Richard Lower and Edmund King in England separately reported successful transfusions from sheep to humans in 1667. Note: it didn't say how the humans behaved afterward.

In 1818 British obstetrician James Blundell performed the first successful transfusion of human blood to a patient for the treatment of post- partum hemorrhage. In 1901 Karl Landsteiner, an Austrian physician, discovered the first three human blood groups. In 1940 the U.S. government established a national blood collection program. In 1941the Red Cross began National Blood Donor Service to collect blood for the U.S. military with Dr. Charles Drew, formerly of the Plasma for British program, as medical director.

I was really impressed but wondered what it would be like during COVID-19. I started donating blood a few years after my near-fatal car collision with a tree in Fort Worth, Texas on December 19, 1966. Five pints of donated blood saved my life. I never knew who those generous souls were or why they donated blood. I knew that none of them had HIV, and I thanked God for them!

I was full of questions on August 6, 2020 when I showed up for my 3:30 PM appointment at St. Irenaeus hall in Cypress, CA. It was sponsored by the Knight of Columbus (K of C). Brother Knights checked me in and took my temperature. Irv Cuevas, a retired reporter from Channel 7 in Los Angeles and a brother knight, met me to take photos, since I was the only knight donating at that time. Irv was just as nervous as I was about this Red Cross donation during the Corona Virus. What dangers would we face?

Red Cross nurse Susan was supervising the donation site. She calmed all our fears with her gentle and knowledgeable approach. She had been with Red Cross for three-and-one-half years. Before, she was a travelling nurse therapist, helping patients recover from knee or hip surgery. She took my blood pressure, pricked my finger for a preliminary blood test, and led me through questions, with all answers being confidential. Irv photographed us together during some questions and while I was on the table. I learned that Red Cross tests for COVID-19 antibodies in all blood donations.

Susan told me that her father was a K of C knight when she lived in New York. When she was a little girl, her dad took her to a K of C bar and let her drink some alcohol." Boy, did I get sick!" she told me. I asked if he got into trouble with her mom, and she exclaimed, "Big time!"

Susan had me answer very personal questions on the computer by myself, and then she wiped all touch areas clean. Some of the questions hadn't changed from my last donation. They involved risky sexual behavior such as sex with men or prostitutes. New to me were questions about having HIV or Corona Virus or being a prostitute. I had a mask on; so Susan couldn't see how red my face was at these embarrassing questions. Also, I had to agree to allow some of my blood to be used for experiments, or Red Cross would not take my blood. Susan assured me the tests would not compromise my Catholic faith and involved such things as testing new serums.

After clearing the questions, I donated a pint of blood. The whole experience with Susan and the Red Cross was wonderful! I got to thank some first responders for their selfless, life-saving work. Susan could not have been nicer in her calm, professional demeanor. I hardly missed that pint of blood. Also, I got to add to my pay back for those who donated blood for me. Could I ever give enough back pay for saving my life?

#### Field Agent Your Shield For Life



"Real Life Stories"

A field agent like me who is lucky enough to be doing this great work for even a few years, undoubtedly has a personal story of the chaos and disorder that a devastated family stares at when there is a sudden loss. If our goal is to protect Catholic families from the near devastation that our Venerable founder faced, then I have to tell the story of how I can help my brother knights. The process of making sure one has adequate protection for the family is not painful; in fact since we are brother knights serving brother knights, it is often a time of not only helping to protect all that is important to a family, but also a shared experience that leads to an abiding friendship.

There are two stories I'd like to relate.

The first is about a young boy named Julius. When Julius was 7 years old his mother, Irene, who was 37, died of cancer. His father, Norman, had two teenage girls along with 7 year old Julius to support and raise. The family was forced to rely on the help and generosity of friends and relatives because Irene died without life insurance. Norman had a three hour commute to his job, but always supported his children's activities. Julius excelled at sports, especially football and his dad spent what little free time he had fostering Julius and his talent. Julius later admitted that he "was handed a life lesson early, growing up with one parent. It wasn't the easiest life—my dad sacrificed a lot."

Fast forward to Julius some 30 years later and he is married, has a wife and two children. He's done quite well for himself both professionally and financially. He has had a distinguished career and he has a considerable amount of life insurance to protect his family. Julius understands protection quite well after the early life he experienced. He understands the hardships of a family that loses a parent and what the children must go through. In his professional life he enjoyed considerable success because of those that protected him. For 13 years he was protected in his career. You see that protection for Julius came in the form of 300 pound offensive linemen...nobody called him Julius. His nickname was "Boomer"...Boomer Esiason—a four time Pro Bowler, an NFL Most Valuable Player and a Walter Peyton NFL Man of the Year. Most importantly, a husband to Cheryl and a father to Sydney and Gunnar.

"Life happens at the most unexpected of times, and life insurance is about protecting the future and the people you love," Boomer says. "Remember, if something happens and you haven't done the planning, the people you leave behind will feel the brunt of your mistakes." That story comes from LifeHappens.org.

There were no whispered worries at the funeral home. There was no GoFundMe page to raise money. There is no concern that the children will not go to college or that the wedding he promised his daughter will not take place. No, their home and future are secure. Who was that knight? I don't know; you don't hear about those men. Because the council didn't have to have a spaghetti dinner or pass the hat. But I assure you he was out there. But you'll never know it...because he planned.

Let's sit down and do some planning and put your mind at ease.


