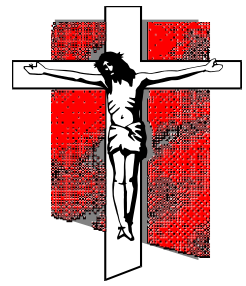

BIBLE AS LITERATURE?

What is that? In the late 1960s I took a course called Bible as Literature. It was taught by Sister St. John at the University of Dallas. You could take it as a Theology or English class. Sister did a remarkable job of introducing the many forms of literature in the Bible. She even assigned us an interesting task. We were to take a bible story to rewrite it and see what happened.

I took the story of Jacob in the Old Testament when he stole the birthright from his twin brother Esau who was born just before Jacob. The story was that Jacob's mother Rebekah helped Jacob pretend to be Esau and serve a meal requested by Isaac, their father who was blind. In the Bible Jacob got away with it and received Isaac's birthright, which was supposed to go to the first born son. In my story, Esau came home early from the hunt and surprised Jacob in the midst of his deception. Esau was hairy, and Jacob was fair skinned. He beat Jacob with his hairy hand. My version didn't go over too well, and I think I was lucky to get a "B" grade on it.

Thank God His version was a lot different! At some point in my studies, I learned that in the early 1900s some Catholic Bibles had a strange warning in them. In clear language the reader was warned not to read the Bible without a priest being present. I think it was because of the fear of Catholics not getting the real messages in the Bible.

Times have changed since Vatican II. Bible studies have produced versions of the Bible in language closer to the meaning of Sacred Scripture, complete with copious footnotes. St. Irenaeus has several bible study classes from 6:30 am for early birds to Deacon Jerry's class at 1pm in the church cry room to evening classes with Deacons Israel and Vernon. In Deacon Jerry's class, we have tackled the books of Isaiah, Hebrews, Revelation, and shorter books. We're now studying Genesis.

Wikipedia says the following about the Bible:

"The Bible is a collection of religious texts that are central to Christianity and Judaism, and esteemed in other Abrahamic religions such as Islam. The Bible is an anthology (a compilation of texts of a variety of forms) originally written in Hebrew (with parts in Aramaic) and Koine Greek. The texts include instructions, stories, poetry, prophecies, and other genres. The collection of materials accepted as part of the Bible by a particular religious tradition or community is called a biblical canon. Believers generally consider it to be a product of divine inspiration, but the way they understand what that means and interpret the text varies...."

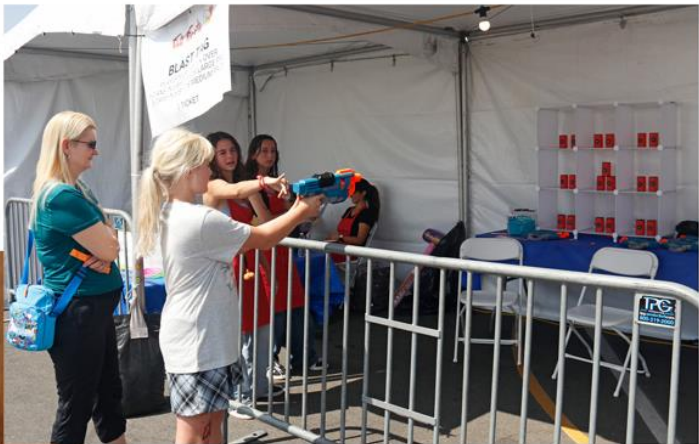

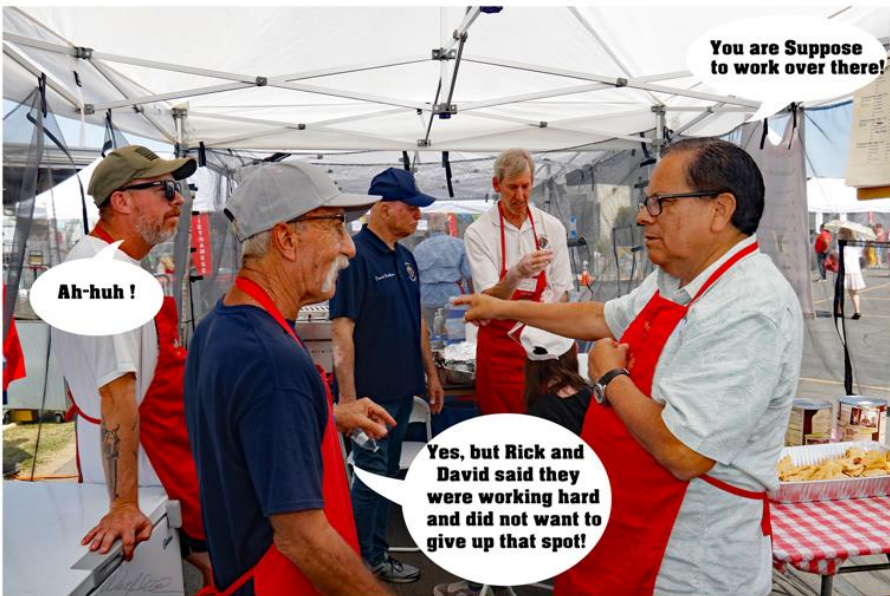
